- **Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word**
Wisdom literature is chock full of aphorisms – short, pithy statements of truth – and the opening reading from Sirach is typical. Jesus shares some of his own with his disciples, and even the psalmist and Saint Paul's letter include a few. These oft-heard sayings come from seldom-heard passages, however. Due to the variability of the liturgical seasons, these particular readings have not been proclaimed at Mass for over twenty years. Let us seize this opportunity to listen to these wise words.
